Principle 9: A commitment to promoting sustainability through education

Initiative to Improve the Quality of Care for People with Diabetes/ Chronic Diseases

(1) Training sessions for the care of people with diabetes

In order to provide new knowledge and information related to the care of people with diabetes, and to build a network of nurses and healthcare professionals involved in diabetes care within the prefecture, a number of training sessions have been held. These include the Iwate Prefecture Diabetes Care Training Sessions which began in 2006, the Tohoku Diabetes Staff Education Seminars which began in 2007, and the Iwate Prefecture Diabetes Care Coastal Area Training Sessions which have been running since 2008. The sessions are held for nurses and healthcare professionals involved in the care of people with diabetes. In particular, in the Tohoku Diabetes Staff Education Seminars, there are training sessions that help carers learn about patients' experiences and how they can be be emotionally supportive of patients.

These training sessions are useful for the continued renewal of qualifications for the Certified Diabetes Educators in Japan.

(2) Training sessions for the care of people with chronic diseases

Tohoku Chronic Disease Care Study Group sessions are held as follow-up training sessions mostly for nurses who have completed the chronic disease clinical nurse specialist (CNS) course in graduate school. These sessions include case studies and nursing studies provided by chronic disease CNSs for general nurses.

2. Initiative to Improve the Quality of Care for Cancer Patients

(1) Cancer care consultation station

(Members: Mai Hosokawa, Mariko Takayashiki, Nobuyo Oikawa)

In order to improve cancer medicine and cancer care in Iwate Prefecture, from 2020, cancer clinical nurse specialists working at our university have operated a cancer care consultation station for healthcare professionals in the Kita-Iwate and Sanriku regions and provide remote consultation services twice a month (3rd Wednesday and 2nd Thursday of each month, 17:00 - 18:00). In 2022, a total of 35 people used the consultation station. On-site consultation services were also provided, and in response to requests from healthcare professionals, in addition to regular consultation services, professionals from the region participated in Zoom conferences and planned training sessions. The local cancer care consultation station operations in 2022 are listed below.

(2) Iwate society of considering cancers

In collaboration with certified nurse specialists and certified nurses in the prefecture, the "Iwate Society of Considering Cancers" was established in 2021, and the Society continuously provides healthcare professionals with training sessions related to palliative care, cancer nursing, clinical ethics, among other things, both online or in-person. In 2022, three training sessions were held and there were 143 participants.

(3) ELNEC-J (web) training program

ELNEC-J (End-of-Life Nursing Education Consortium Japan) training sessions (4 sessions in total) for nurses who provide end-of-life care and palliative care, established as an educational program of the Japanese Society of Palliative Medicine in order to equip nurses with the necessary skills for such care, have been held regularly since 2021 using a remote conference system. Nine certified and specialist nurses from within and outside of Iwate prefecture served as lecturers for the training sessions, and there were 11 participants.
